

# Intuition Know-How Integration Options

## Integration Options

Intuition's provides a wide range of integration options for clients wishing to access the Intuition Know-How library. Intuition has successfully integrated with numerous Learning systems including Degreed, Cornerstone, SuccessFactors, Saba, SumTotal, Edcast.

### AICC

With this approach the AICC eLearning standard is used to authenticate and identify users against the Intuition servers. The Intuition Know-How content resides on the Intuition servers and communicates tracking information with the client LMS in real time via the AICC eLearning standard. With the AICC approach each individual item of content must be loaded to the client LMS with the relevant meta-data and an AICC launch URL which directs the user to the content on the Intuition server. These entries can be loaded to the client LMS manually using AICC stub files provided by Intuition or by integrating with the standard Intuition AICC Catalogue API (documentation available on request). This approach is the most simple and straightforward to implement and is supported by almost all standard LMS platforms.

### Single Sign-On (SSO)

With this approach the SSO SAML 2.0 standard is used to authenticate and identify users against the Intuition servers. The Intuition Know-How content resides on the Intuition servers and communicates tracking either via a real time API call back to the client LMS or via a scheduled completion data feed (see below). Alternatively the client LMS can call the standard Intuition API to retrieve tracking information for a specific user as required. With the SSO approach each individual item of content must be loaded to the client LMS with relevant meta-data and an SSO deep launch URL which directs the user to the content on the Intuition server. These entries can be loaded to the client LMS manually using data provided by Intuition or by integrating with the standard Intuition SSO Catalogue API (documentation available on request).

### Custom API Integration

Where an LMS or LXP provider is unable to leverage the standard integration options as outlined above Intuition can develop a custom integration specific to that provider. A custom API integration is usually built by Intuition against the standard API provided by the LMS/LXP platform and aims to fully automate the integration and management of the Intuition Know-How library via those APIs. Intuition maintains custom API integrations with a number of existing LMS and LXP systems (details available on request).

### Completion Data Feed

A completion data feed can be used to send user tracking data from the Intuition system to the client LMS or LXP system. Completion feeds can be scheduled to run as frequently as required and provide an efficient way of synchronising essential tracking data between systems without the need for an API or AICC integration.

### User Data Feed

A user data feed can be used to push user management data into the Intuition system or pull data from the system via a flat file or similar to or from an external system such as a HR management database or other LMS. User data feeds are generally scheduled to run once per day and provide an efficient way of synchronising user data between systems for the purposes of pre-authentication or limiting content access to particular groups of users.
